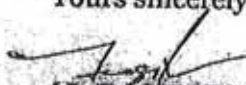
Sirs,

The Legal Education Committee at its meeting held on 25th August, 2012 has passed the following Resolution in respect of minimum percentage of marks.

It has been brought to the notice of this Committee that number of institutions including CLAT are fixing 50% total marks for the General Category and 45% for Reserved Category i.e. SC/ST who are eligible to sit in entrance exam. In this respect, our Rule-7 of Rules of Legal Education-2008 is very clear, it laid down that Bar Council India may from time to time stipulate minimum percentage of marks not below than 45% of the total marks in case of general category and 40% of total marks in the case of SC and ST applicant for qualifying examination. Since our Rules are very clear, other institutions, colleges, universities, who are going to give law degree for the purpose of practicing law in courts, while laying down Rules regarding minimum qualifying marks have to follow this Rule which is statutory and bounding. In view of this it is made clear through this resolution this should be kept in mind while laying down minimum qualifying marks for appearing in entrance test and admission. This should be communicated to all the universities and colleges.

This is for your information and necessary action.
